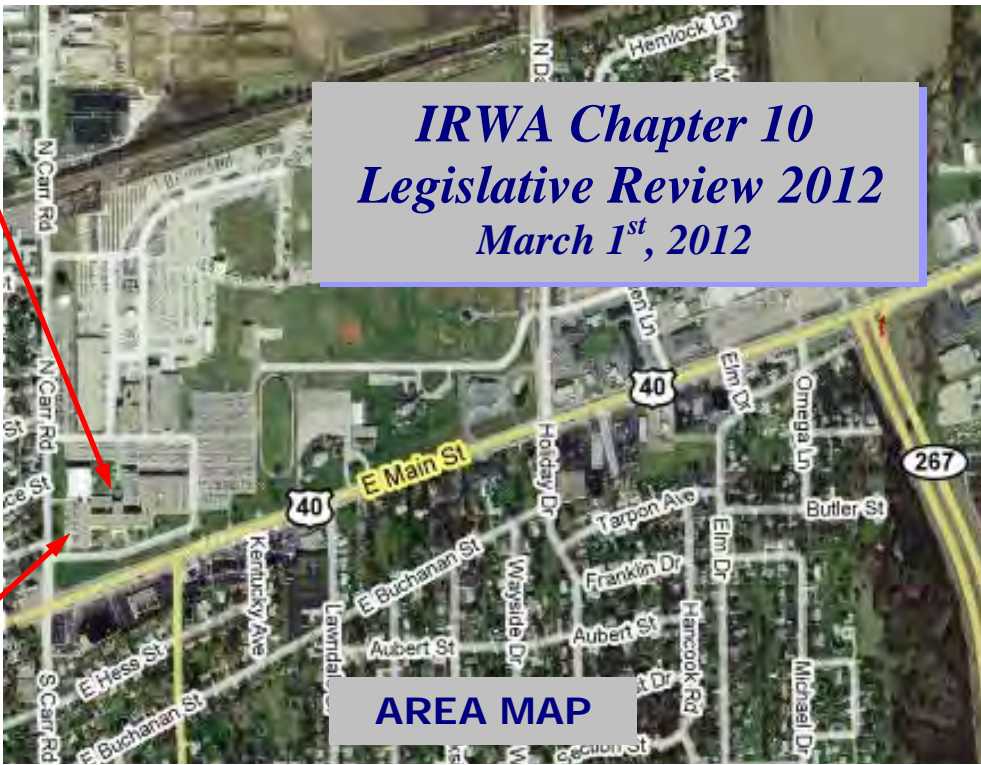

Back then I didn't have any ... darn, is time mean or what???

I really wasn't afraid to be installed, as I had already been installed for every office in the chapter, and besides all of the chapter board and active past president had insured me that they were not going to let "some woman" mess up their chapter. What I was afraid of was giving that acceptance speech; in fact, I was so frightened I wasn't sure the words would even come out!

A few days earlier, I confided in my boss, a long-standing and active member, who whenever he spoke, always had command of the room, no nervousness whatsoever. The advice he gave me was to start with, Good Evening and that I hoped everyone had enjoyed the dinner and was having a great time and then to briefly tell them the plans I wanted to carry out as President. PLANS ... oh my ... I hadn't gotten that far, so I scrambled to think of a plan or two.

As I stepped to the podium (scribbled notes in hand), I took some really deep breaths and shaking like a leaf inside, looked up at the crowd. What I saw was about half of those in attendance starring at me like I was the She-Devil come back from the dead! Who were they? They were the wives of our members ... a cardinal rule in acquiring right of way, never forget the wife, and, oh Lord, I had forgotten about the wives. Well, in time things did get better, especially when they realized I didn't want their husbands anymore than they did!

I believe I worked very hard that year, but did I do it alone? Absolutely not, I was most fortunate to have had teachers, mentors, supporters and promoters who not only helped me through that year, but continued to push me to be more involved in all of the opportunities the Right of Way Association had to offer, and I did. I am honestly grateful that I followed their advice.

I don't think I truly realized the significance, historical or otherwise of that installation in 1988 and I know I have never personally thanked those members who gave me so much. 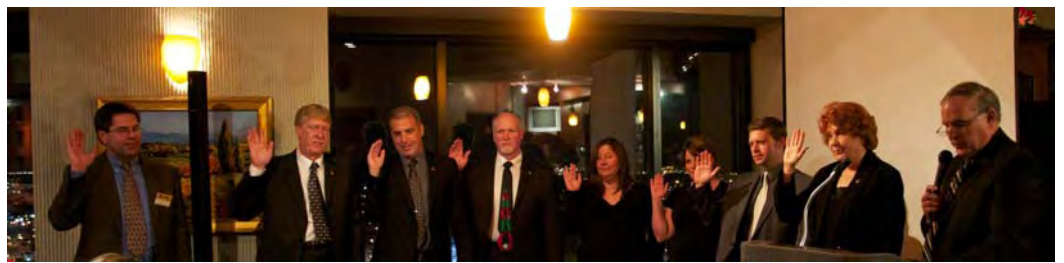

Indiana “The Crossroads of America”

The Crossroads of America is a nickname and motto given to the state of Indiana as it, and, more specifically, the city of Indianapolis is the hub for several major Interstate highways that criss-cross the state, connecting Hoosiers to the rest of the United States.

Adoption of the Indiana State Motto

In the 1930s, the *Evansville Courier*, now the *Evansville Courier & Press*, ran a column called "Paragraphy". J. Roy Strickland, its author, made note of the fact that Indiana had no official state motto. He wrote about this in his column and suggested to readers that, perhaps, it was time to enact one. In fact, Mr. Strickland was instrumental in getting Indiana to adopt a state motto by soliciting suggestions and providing those suggestions to the Indiana General Assembly. He wrote,

"...in my column, Paragraphy, I started a campaign for suggestions for a motto for Indiana. In a period of two or three weeks, I received three hundred and twenty-four suggestions. These were printed in folder form, without the names and addresses of the senders, and forwarded to the State legislature then in session at Indianapolis. A committee of three from the House and two from the Senate took this list of mottoes and selected 'The Crossroads of America.'"

A joint resolution, to adopt "The Crossroads of America" as the official motto of Indiana, was crafted by the Indiana House of Representatives that resolved:

"Section 1. Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring, that the expression 'The Crossroads of America' is hereby designated and adopted as the official State motto or slogan for the State of Indiana."

Joint Resolution No. 6, adopting *The Crossroads of America* as the official motto of Indiana, was adopted by the Eightieth Session of the General Assembly on March 2, 1937. Note that *The Crossroads of America* was adopted as the official state motto or slogan. We can't help but wonder when it's used as a motto and when it's used as a slogan.

First Crossroads was in Terre Haute

In the early days of cross-country travel (*by horse and wagon*), Terre Haute, Indiana benefited by its location on the old National Road between Indianapolis and Vandalia, Illinois. The National Road was later named U.S. Highway 40 when it was made a U.S. highway in 1926.

At about the same time, U.S. Highway 41 was commissioned between Chicago, Illinois and Miami, Florida. This north-south highway through downtown Terre Haute followed Seventh Street at the time, and met U.S. 40, which followed Wabash Avenue, the main east-west street in town. The Seventh and Wabash intersection thus became known as the "Crossroads of America" an appellation now memorialized with a historical marker at that corner



About the Indiana State Motto

The year was 1937 and the motto certainly suggests that the intersecting of important roads, railroads and waterways of the nation occurs within the boundaries of the State of Indiana. Indeed, Indiana was on the path west by many settlers coming from the northeast and east central states.

The first major road to cross the state was the historic Cumberland, or National, Road, now labeled US Route 40. This road was built in the early 1800s. Many railroads provide freight service in Indiana and the Lake Michigan ports of Burns Harbor, Buffington, Gary and Indiana Harbor provide connections, via the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Seaway for oceangoing ships from around the world. Smaller ports, Southwind and Clark, are found on the Ohio River, providing access to the Mississippi River and the Gulf of Mexico to the south.

The Indiana Department of Administration states:

"'The Crossroads of America' signifies the importance of waterways, railroads, highways and other transportation facilities in the state, viewed by many as some of the finest in the nation."

The Indiana Code

The adoption of the official state motto of Indiana was by House Joint Resolution and is not documented in the Indiana Code.

US 31 Project to be Accelerated

INDIANAPOLIS – Governor Mitch Daniels said the Kokomo segment of the U.S. 31 Corridor project has been accelerated and should open to traffic at the end of 2013, two years earlier than scheduled, and all but the southern portion of the U.S. 31 Corridor project will be completed by the end of 2014.

Speaking to members of the U.S. 31 Coalition at its annual legislative day, the governor said that so far, the state has invested more than \$200 million on the three segments of the U.S. 31 Corridor project near Kokomo, South Bend and Hamilton County, and they are about 20 percent complete.

“We’re taking an hour off the round trip and most of that will be achieved four to five years from now,” Daniels said. “While other states have shut down their road programs completely, Indiana is breaking all records for investments in our infrastructure. That’s how you attack a recession.”

Here is a Corridor update:

U.S. 31 Kokomo

·U.S. 31 freeway construction near Kokomo has been accelerated and is now on schedule for opening to traffic at the end of 2013. ·Two miles of new highway alignment are under construction. Two bridges carrying county road bridges over the planned highway are already open to traffic.

U.S. 31 Hamilton County

·The state has reaffirmed its financial commitment to upgrading existing U.S. 31 to freeway standards from I-465 to State Road 38 in Hamilton County. The project is on schedule to start in 2011 and be fully open to traffic at the end of 2018. The State Road 38 interchange is expected to be open to traffic by the end of 2012. At the same time, construction will be underway on one of this project’s largest phases to build an interchange system at 146th Street and 151st Street.

U.S. 31 Plymouth to South Bend

·Ten miles of new highway alignment are already under construction.
·The project is on schedule to meet its target opening date at the end of 2014.

Total investments in the U.S. 31 corridor are expected to exceed \$1 billion.
